Shirley Simien Andrus and Carolyn Simien Marshall born in Mossville, Louisiana to parents Lawrence James Simien, Senior, and Beatrice Hardy Simien; Marshall born May 21, 1956; grandparents; earliest memories of Mossville; community's family-oriented nature; father's grocery store; food prices growing up; attending Sacred Heart Catholic School in Lake Charles; most of Mossville is kin; father took sick, so mother started working as a cook; family moved to Lake Charles in 1965 for convenience's sake; Andrus's childhood fear of chickens; "mark of the rooster"; outhouses; opinions on city living versus country living; experiences as grandmothers; legend of a phantom horse that lived in the woods; home-grown food superior to store-bought; gardening; butchering; church leaders; father was Knights of Peter Claver; graduated from Marion High School; Marshall started a family after high school, while Andrus attended McNeese State University for two years; parents raised them to help people; Marshall's experiences working as a substitute teacher; dancing zydeco; girls never stayed home alone; boys had to work, but girls had to follow parents to the dances.
