Born north of Mossville in 1944 to Morris and Irene Prater; oldest of three sisters; father's work at a plant; mother a homemaker; grandparents Earthy and Eunice Prater; maternal grandparents Sophie and Joseph Vincent; family's move to Mossville in 1952; Prater Road named for grandfather Earthy; family names; original families; property ownership; neighbors; the Paradise Club; memories of building the house in Mossville; hurricane Audrey and seeing water in every direction; many homes built on piers, but some were not; childhood home; father took up gardening late in life; mother a fantastic cook, making things like banana pudding and potato pies from scratch; church attendance; leaders at Mt.
