Born in Eunice, Louisiana in St. Landry Parish on January 26, 1949; attended St. Matilda Catholic School in Eunice, and later Charles Drew; memories of Hurricane Audrey; first impressions of Mossville, which was different than land-locked Eunice; trade as a pipefitter, eventually hired at the Olin plant; memories of Pete Moss, who used to ride his mule and buggy through town; other jobs include construction work and employment at BFI Waste Management for five or six years; canteens and the cinema on Highway 90 offered some entertainment for young people; remembers when people realized water wasn't safe for drinking, citing contaminated waste holes a possible reason; BFI never exposed for their role in the wastedumping; family had a garden and also raised fowl; says everyone in Mossville is like family, and wishes another Mossville could be built.
