## **BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE**

The Anglo-American Art Museum opened in 1962 as a small period room museum in the Memorial Tower on Louisiana State University's (LSU) Baton Rouge campus. A period room is a display combining architectural components, pieces of furniture, and decorative objects organized to evoke or recreate an interior, very often domestic and dating from a past era. The museum and its collection were established through a generous gift to LSU in 1959 from an anonymous donor who wished to support an institution that would illustrate British and continental influences on early American art and culture in the South. In 1992, the university changed the name of the museum to the LSU Museum of Art to reflect how its collecting practices had expanded since the 1970s with acquisitions of Louisiana and global cultural materials. The museum moved to the Shaw Center for the Arts in downtown Baton Rouge to improve access, opening there in March 2005.

## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The LSU Museum of Art records consist of correspondence, building records, posters, photographs, and other records concerning the organization, operation, construction, and public relations of the LSU Museum of Art between 1957 and 2001. Records mainly concern the remodeling of the Memorial Tower and the installation of the museum (1957-1962), the annual antiques forums in the 1970s, and the supportive works of the Friends of the Anglo-American Art Museum. Photographs document antiques, the museum building and its formal opening ceremonies, and various groups and individuals. Also included is a VHS videocassette of the museum's silver anniversary celebration in 1987.

#### Subgroup 1. Museum Records, 1958-2001, undated.

#### Series I. Correspondence, 1958-1979.

Arranged alphabetically by the correspondent, this series consists of correspondence regarding art work for the museum and its purchase; letters of congratulations to Paul Chatelain upon his appointment as the first curator of the Anglo-American Art Museum; letters from Harnett T. Kane inviting Chatelain to various events; correspondence between curator H. Parrott Bacot and various museums in Louisiana and elsewhere seeking information on decorative arts; correspondence between James Key Reeve, second curator of the museum, and J. H. Mattox of the LSU Bureau of Public Relations and various members of LSU's administration pertaining to conditions at the museum; correspondence between Robert Day, chairman of the Department of Fine Arts, and members of LSU's administration concerning the Department's relationship with the art museum; and correspondence pertaining to the formal opening of the museum.

#### Series II. Topical Files, 1961-2001, undated.

Arranged alphabetically by topic, this series consists of museum guides and catalogs, inventories, records of grant proposals and funding, posters and publicity for the museum, and a report on the status and development plans for the museum in the 1970s. Topics discussed are the restoration and refurnishing of the Kent Plantation House in Alexandria, Louisiana; donations of money and artwork to the museum; accreditation data for the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools; needs and goals of the LSU Museum Complex, of which the art museum was a part; inventories of museum holdings; and publicity for the museum.

#### Series III. Photographs, 1962-1979, undated.

This series documents antiques, the museum building and its formal opening ceremonies, the 1979 Friends of the LSU Museum of Art annual meeting, and various groups and individuals. This series previously had been organized as the Louisiana State University Photograph Collection, Museum of Art, RG #A5000.0406.

Arranged chronologically, this series contains records of the renovation of the Memorial Tower into a museum, construction of the exhibit areas, and subsequent repairs to the building.
