BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

The Louisiana State University (LSU) Department of English traditionally has emphasized literary theory and American literature, including the literature of the Southern United States. Cleanth Brooks and Robert Penn Warren collaborated with others in the department to publish The Southern Review (1935-1942), which was revived in 1965. Department members also founded the Henry James Review and now edit three other journals: 1650-1850: Ideas, Aesthetics and Inquiries in the Early Modern Era; Atlantic Studies: Literary, Cultural and Historical Perspectives; and Exquisite Corpse. They also edit four book series: Theoretical Horizons in American Culture, Literary Conversations, Feminist Theory and Criticism, and Modern Dramatists Research and Production Sourcebooks.

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SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This record group is comprised of records from the Bureau of Veterans Education, files pertaining to former faculty of the English Department, the Creative Writing Program, and the English Department. The Bureau of Veterans Education was established at the end of World War II to advise veterans of and help them obtain the benefits provided under the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944, better known as the G.I. Bill of Rights. The bureau also provided information about the University in general and courses of study including classes in the English Department. The former faculty files consist of offers of employment, notifications of raises, and congratulatory letters on promotions and awards. The Creative Writing Program records pertain to the establishment of the program, early curricula and course offerings, the faculty members in the program, and materials promoting the program. Also included are invitations and publicity for local and area writers to speak to students in the program, materials related to fundraising and potential donors, and awards and book reviews and announcements of the faculty in the program. The English Department records pertain to creative writing before a formal program was established, the master of fine arts (MFA) program and the faculty members involved with it, promotional materials for writing events and readings, and writers speaking at LSU.

Subgroup 1. Bureau of Veterans Education Records, 1944-1958, undated.

Series I. Budgets, 1948-1951.

Arranged chronologically, this series contains the monthly budgets for the Bureau of Veterans Education.

Series II. Correspondence, 1944-1949.

Arranged alphabetically by the last name of the correspondent then chronologically, this series primarily contains letters between potential students and L. B. Lucky, director of the Bureau of Veterans Education, seeking information on LSU course offerings and the kinds of assistance available for veterans of World War II under the G.I. Bill of Rights. Other correspondence consists of letters between the Veterans' Administration and Lucky pertaining to regulations and information on educational benefits for veterans, letters between Lucky and Louisiana congressmen Henry D. Larcade, Jr. and James H. Morrison pertaining to legislation on veterans benefits, and correspondence between Lucky and Gen. Louis F. Guerre, regional director of the Veterans' Administration on whether or not student veterans interrupted their coursework at LSU and various topics related to administrative housekeeping.

Series III. Student and Veterans Rosters, 1944-1952. Arranged chronologically, this series consists of lists of student veterans attending LSU.

Series IV. Topical Files, 1944-1958, undated.

Arranged alphabetically by topic, this series consists of assignments for English classes and other classes in the College of Arts & Sciences, information on correspondence courses and courses offered through the General Extension Division (now the Division of Continuing Education), grade distribution in the College of Agriculture, studies of student veterans' scholastic issues, and lists of student veterans requesting assistance and submitting Veterans' Administration (VA) forms to process their requests. Other items include reports on post-World War II education problems, the needs of families of student veterans, circular letters and technical bulletins from the Veterans' Administration providing instructions and notices of new regulations regarding VA benefits under the G.I. Bill, and timesheets and schedules for tutors assisting student veterans.

Subgroup 2. Former Faculty Files, 1931-1995.

Series I. Topical Files, 1931-1995.

Arranged alphabetically by the faculty member's last name, this series consists of biographical information and newspaper clippings for members of the English Department faculty. Other items include congratulatory letters to faculty members regarding promotion and tenure, publication honors, letters offering employment, and resignation letters. Faculty members include Cleanth Brooks, Katherine Daniels, Thomas Austin Kirby, William Van O'Connor, Walker Percy, Katherine Anne Porter, Robert Penn Warren, and John Hazard Wildman, among others.

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Subgroup 3. Creative Writing Program Records, 1985-2010, undated.

Series I. Topical Files, 1985-2007, undated.

Arranged alphabetically by topic, this series contains correspondence, reports, curricula, and other items pertaining to the establishment and continuance of the English Department's Creative Writing Program.

Series II. Printed Material and Photographic Items, 1987-2010, undated. Arranged chronologically, this series consists of posters advertising the Creative Writing Program's MFA program, poetry and fiction readings given by faculty and students in the MFA program, talks given by authors such as Steven Soderbergh and Ernest J. Gaines, a conference on the legacy of Robert Penn Warren, and the Writers Harvest for the Homeless (poetry and short story readings given to benefit homeless people). Also included are the architectural drawings for the Robert Penn Warren Seminar Room in Allen Hall and a few photographic items.

Subgroup 4. English Department Records, 1967-1999, undated.

Series I. Topical Files, 1967-1999, undated.

Arranged alphabetically by topic then chronologically, this series contains correspondence, reports, curricula, and other records pertaining to creative writing in the English Department prior to the establishment of the Creative Writing Program. This series also includes information on the Master of Fine Arts program, the student publication *Delta*, readings given and prizes won by faculty, talks given by visiting writers, and writers' workshops.

Series II. Printed Material, 1977-1998, undated.

Arranged chronologically, this series consists of posters, flyers, and other promotional items for events hosted by or of interest to the English Department and posters advertising the English Department.
